Dress Code Policy

The South Australian Spirit of Cricket pledge

We are committed to creating an enduring legacy for South Australian cricket, by ensuring it is played with honour, dignity and respect, and providing a fun and safe environment for all.

South Central Junior Cricket Association has a commitment to the Spirit of Cricket, and all that it stands for applies not only to the Laws of the Game, but is also fundamental when applying our competition bylaws and playing conditions. We encourage all clubs, players and supporters to uphold this commitment to the Spirit of Cricket.

South Central Junior Cricket Association (SCJCA) supports Community Clubs to wear safe professional uniforms. As an Association we have the following standards to be applied for the Community Clubs:

- Community Club playing shirt, with collar and Club logos. Community Club sponsors logo's displayed appropriately.
- White pants
- White or cream socks
- Predominately white cricket or sports shoes
- It is compulsory that all junior players must wear a helmet when batting, no exceptions. All wicketkeepers must wear a helmet at all times.
 - A good helmet has a face grill, fits comfortably, protects the back of the head and the temples, is light and well ventilated and hygienic.
 - Only helmets that display the Australian Standards Approval should be worn (BS7928:2013).
- A Community Club Cap pr Wide Brimmed Hat
- The use of correctly fitting leg and thigh pads, gloves and cricket protectors (box).

SCJCA is a sun safe Association. Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world and we support and encourage sun safety at all times. SCJCA encourages its players to:

- Apply sunscreen before, during and throughout the game as appropriate
- Sunglasses are permitted to be worn.
- Players and spectators to remain in the shade while waiting to play or during breaks.
